The information provided in this form will be used <u>in conjunction with other criteria</u> to determine whether a post qualifies for a Consumables Shipment.

COMPLETING THE REPORT

- (a) Respondents should read each question carefully before answering. Sometimes answering "Yes" to a question may not always be a positive response and answering "No" to a question may not always be a negative response. All questions should be answered with "Yes" or "No." "N/A" is not an acceptable answer.
- (b) Respondents should answer each question objectively, giving detailed explanations in the designated sections on quality of consumables, usability of consumables, etc. where necessary. We are interested not just in what is available, but also your comments on the quality of those foods and other items available. Products do not have to be American brands. If there is a local or imported product of reasonable quality, answer "Yes" for availability and if necessary comment in the appropriate section. If the quality of a product is extremely poor and equivalent to the product is unavailable, mark "No" for availability and provide details in the comments section.
- (c) Respondents should describe situations and conditions that affect the majority of eligible USG civilian employees. Responding officers may want to create a committee representing a cross-section of all personnel at post before completing the questionnaire because many questions refer to situations and conditions that may not have the same effect on all employees at a post. This committee should be composed of employees and family members, men and women, those married or single, with or without
- (d) Respondents should note that consumables cover the basics. In addition, consumables shipments are not intended to cover the high cost of products. Post Allowance is the appropriate venue to cover exorbitant costs of goods available on the local market and post should contact the Office of Allowances to address the issue.
